We are continuing to monitor Hurricane Irma for its potential impact on John Knox Village.

Most models project that Irma will take a northward turn and based on this 2PM update we will begin feeling Irma's winds by Friday evening.

The time to prepare is NOW.

To assist in your preparation, Transportation is

providing additional shuttle service to Publix Wednesday, Sept. 6th and Thursday, Sept. 7th beginning both days at 12:00 Noon. Sign-up sheets will be at the Cassels Tower Front Desk.

Also, as always, Individual Services are available through our Home Health Agency. For information please contact them at (954) 783-4009.

Please note, Villa residents are required to evacuate their Villas if Irma is projected to become a Category 2 or greater storm.

If Irma is projected to be a Category 4 or greater storm, apartment residents on the following floors need to move floors below the evacuated floors: CT Floors 16 & 17; VT 10th Floor; HT 10th Floor; EL 3rd Floor.

These notices will be distributed to all residents as quickly as possible following the 5 PM update received from the U.S. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, throughout the duration of the storm.

PREPARATION CHECKLIST

Now is the time to make sure you have a two-week supply of prescription medicines and that you are stocked up with the following items:

Suggested Items for Your At-Home Hurricane Kit:

- Three gallons of water per person per day for 10 days
- Two flashlights with batteries and spares (Use of candles, oil lamps or sterno is prohibited)
- A 10-day supply of non-perishable food that can be eaten without heating/cooking
- · A manually operated can opener
- A 14-day supply of medications
- Battery operated radio with extra batteries

Needed Items Should You Evacuate to the Auditorium or an Apartment Building Party Room:

- A three-day supply of food ready to take with you
- Sheets, pillow, blanket, towels and wash cloths
- Change of clothing 3 day supply
- Incontinence supplies
- Personal medication for 2 weeks (in original prescription container)
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Three gallons of drinking water per person
- Books, cards, games
- Manual can opener
- Keys to your apartment or villa and automobile
- Your personal identification (drivers license, etc.)
- Apartment Party Rooms Refrigerators are reserved for medications
- Red electrical outlets in Apartment Buildings are to be used for emergency purposes only
- Residents should print out a list of all their important personal contacts whose numbers are typically stored in their cellphones
